Knowledge sharing in ENOS

- The philosophy of ENOS is that the best way to enable onshore storage is to do it step by step, starting with successful pilot sites. When we gain trust from various stakeholders (including the public), we can then go a step further a try larger-scale demonstration projects.
- Why knowledge sharing? We do not want to reinvent the wheel. There is already a large knowledge « out there » about running a pilot site successfully
- How?
 - European liaison and knowledge exchange: Ketzin, Lacq-Rousse, Heletz, Carbfix, etc.
 - Twinning sites. Ex: Hontomin and Battelle; LBr-1 – Kansas Wellington Field
 - Leakage simulation alliance: a partnership between sites performing controlled released on-field
 - Experience sharing focus groups

Experience sharing focus groups

- Open to all researchers and sites around the world
- Based around specific issues
- 7 Webinars and 3 workshops planned
- Each on a pre-defined topic
- Different than research priorities – the goal is to remove practical hurdles to running a successful pilot site

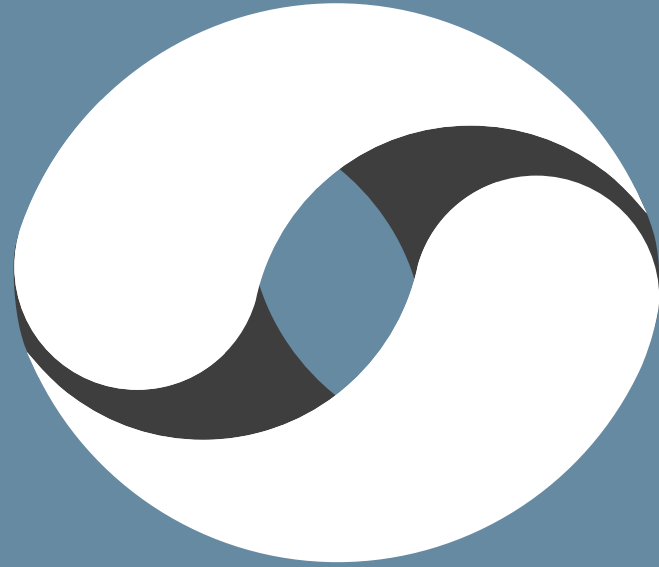
